Fellow judge Renee Salewski said she agreed, noting, ?It is essentially that level of confidence and commitment to what they are up to; not just the song itself, but commitment to their choices and just a sense of honesty.?

Having taken part in the preliminary round, judge Philip Troth knew they had a difficult task ahead of them, and said the hardest part of the whole thing was that only one singer could win.

?It takes a bunch of cajones to get up there and do this!? he said.

In the end, it came down to five: Stephane, Nikita, Jaclyn, runner-up Kahlan and winner Olivia.

?I couldn't process it at first,? said Olivia of her big win. ?I am really happy and I am really lucky to be here.?

Having entered the competition with Every Rose Has Its Thorn by Poison, Olivia said she has a penchant for classic rock because she feels it suits her range and, perhaps more importantly, they are more ?interesting songs to sing.?

?I auditioned two years ago [for Teen Idol] but I didn't get in,? she explained. ?Competition isn't my favorite thing in the world. It makes me nervous sometimes, but my mom encouraged me to try out this year and my singing teacher also encouraged me to try out.
