If you're going to write it, it has to move you in one way or another, bring out some kind of response in you, positive or negative, enough to move you to do something about it. Love is a classic example of that. It is always there, it is always a motivator. It can be an enlightener or a complete depressant. There is very little middle ground happening there.?
