?Unfortunately women's rugby operates on a pay-to-play model, meaning that players need to find ways to cover their expenses in order to play,? said Fane. ?Largely this is done through fundraising. For example, I have paid to fly out to British Columbia for final tryouts and will be paying part of the costs of flights and accommodations in Australia.?
