We need your feedback! The Town is hosting a Public Open House for the Mavrinac Park design on Tuesday, May 31. The purpose of the meeting is to present the conceptual plan for Mavrinac Park and to obtain input and comments from the public on the proposed design and facilities to be included in the park. I encourage all to attend and provide your input.

Earlier this month, the Province announced significant proposed changes to four key land use planning documents: the Greenbelt Plan, the Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, the Niagara Escarpment Plan and the Oak Ridges Moraine Plan. The proposed changes could have a significant impact on the planning of communities in York Region. The next step in the coordinated land use planning review involves a second round of consultations and a number of public open houses. The closest planned public meeting is in Vaughan on Thursday, June 2.
