I would also like to thank the Government of Ontario for extending the deadline for feedback on the four provincial land-use plans that manage growth, curb sprawl, build complete communities and protect the natural environment in Ontario's Greater Golden Horseshoe.

Land-use planning has a tremendous effect on the quality of life for our citizens and we appreciate the opportunity for stakeholders to provide meaningful feedback. In May 2016, the Province released proposed changes to the Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, the Greenbelt Plan, the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan and the Niagara Escarpment Plan and sought feedback from stakeholders, the public and indigenous communities.

The original deadline for public feedback on these land-use plans was the end of September. Following meetings with the Greater Toronto Area and Hamilton Mayors and Regional Chairs, as well as several other stakeholders, the Province agreed to extend the deadline to provide input on the plans to October 31, 2016.
