This 20th Anniversary Concert will feature past conductors, such as David Holborn, and the Choir's 20-year history, and most definitely the joy of singing. The choir has about 50 members and rehearses weekly at Bethel Christian Reformed Community Church.

Bethel Church holds up to 400 people and any money raised is used by the choir, for things such as singing lessons, hall rentals, and general expenses of running a choir. The choir members meet every Monday night from September until June at Bethel Church.
