On another note, municipalities in Ontario face exceptional pressure about infrastructure development, access to quality services and the ability to generate sources of revenue to meet the needs of residents. With the emergence of cutbacks and increasing cost pressures, we need to find alternate sources of revenue versus the current user fees, taxes and development charges. The Provincial Government is investigating additional revenue opportunities similar to those provided for in The City of Toronto Act, which includes a municipal land transfer tax. The proposal is still under consideration by the Ontario Government. Stay tuned for further developments.

With the imminent onset of snow and ice, please remember that Winter Parking Restrictions are in effect from Sunday, November 15 to Friday, April 15, 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. Vehicles are not permitted to be parked on the street, over sidewalks or onto the roadway. This is hazardous for residents as it obstructs the ability for Infrastructure and Environmental Services staff to plow our roads and sidewalks.
