Since the soccer season began, the team has been organizing events and drumming up interest for a variety of different causes including donating clothes, toys and baby necessities to a family in Newmarket, raising \$1,000 for the Heart and Stroke Foundation through a 1K run and also frequently visiting and spending time with their friend Carter.

Coach Georgiopoulos said he is very proud of his team for their hard work and dedication.

?In life you don't always get rewarded for the efforts you put in, so it was really good that this team was rewarded for all their community efforts,? he said. ?Every team that I coach, I always tell the parents that my goal is to create good soccer players, but great citizens of their community.?
