Offensively, Robinson capped off his stellar day by going deep in his first at bat, while Ted Beadle went an impressive eight-for-eight on the day.

A rematch with the Knights on Sunday afternoon ended with a tie, after Devin Wu put up a masterful performance on the mound to allow just two runs.

Putting in an entire seven innings, Wu gave up just six hits and three walks while striking out two batters.
